

The most well known is Blessed Cardinal John Henry Newman who was a British 19th century theologian, poet, Catholic priest and cardinal. He originally was an Anglican priest who converted to Catholicism. He was made cardinal in 1879 though he was not a bishop. He founded the Oratory of St Philip Neri and two schools for boys. He was especially dedicated to education. The catholic high school in West Palm Beach is named after him. The two miracles attributed to his intercession involved the healing of a deacon with a spinal condition and a pregnant American woman with a life threatening diagnosis.








Suffered a loss? The St. Peter Bereavement Group meets on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7:00pm in the JPII
