

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, when the three kings, or magi visited the baby Jesus. Epiphany means manifestation or a sudden realization about the nature or meaning of something. It comes from the

Greek word, *epiphainein* which means 'reveal'. In some countries, Epiphany is a holy day of obliga-tion, celebrated on January 6th, the twelfth day after Christmas. In the United States, Epiphany is not a holy day of obligation, instead its celebration is transferred to the first Sunday after January 1st

It is one of the oldest Christian Feasts, celebrated since the end of the second century, even before the Christmas holiday was estab-lished. The Gospel of Matthew says the three kings followed a star across the desert to Bethlehem, bearing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

- Gold a symbol of wealth and power, identifies the recipient as a king.
- 2. Frankincense the crystalized resinous sap of a tree used as incense and as an offering, is symbolic of prayer.
- 3. Myrrh another resinous tree sap, was used in healing liniments and as an embalming ointment. Myrrh is an odd gift for a child—so, even at the beginning of Jesus' life on earth, this gift foreshadows his death.
