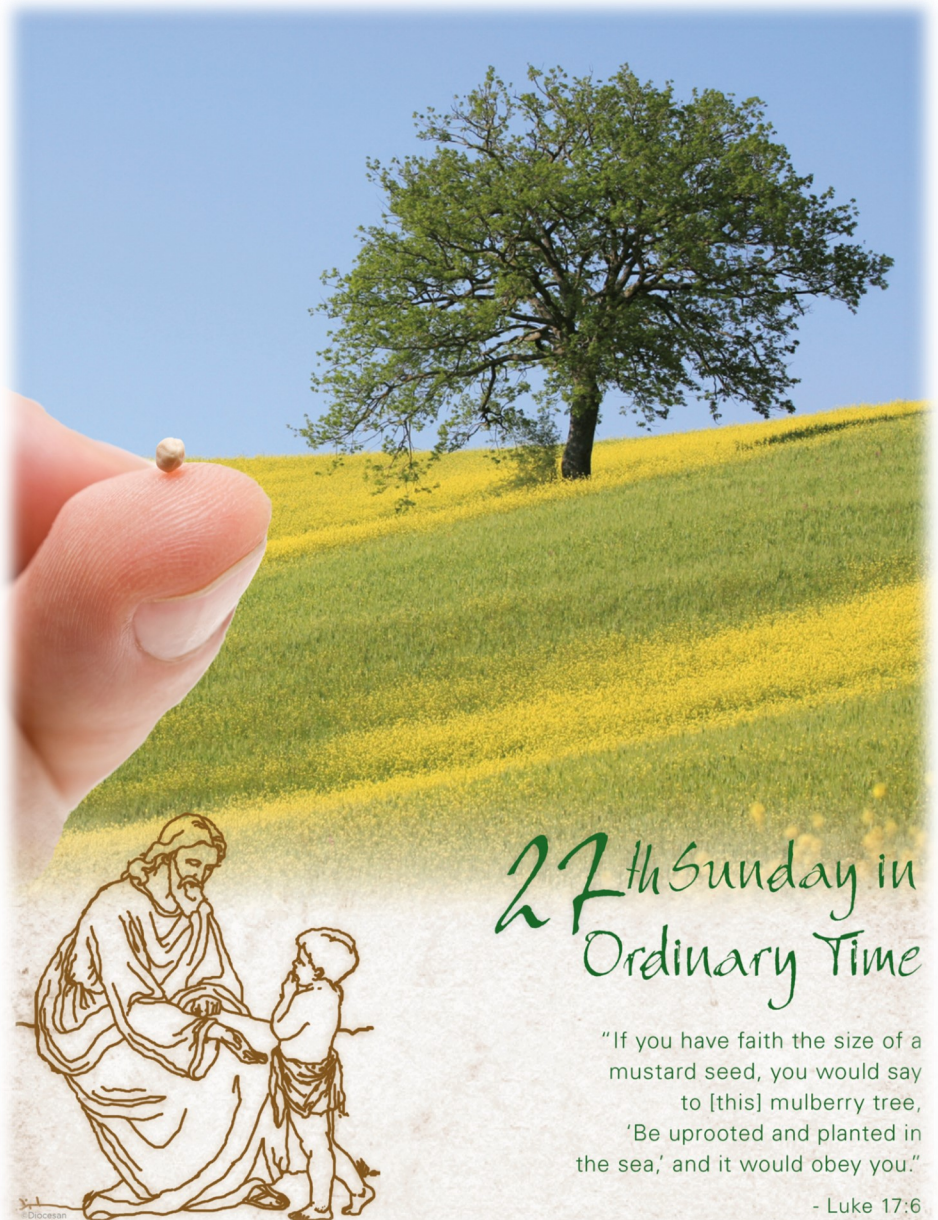

A Message from Fr Ray

In the past 5 months I'm sure some of you have wondered, "Why is Fr. Ray limping?" Why is he wearing sandals – is he becoming a Franciscan? No. It all started in May when I had an infection in one of my toes. The doctor removed the infection, but after a month, the wound wasn't healing. I was then sent to a vascular surgeon & he discovered that I had a blockage in the main artery of my right leg. So, in the middle of June I had a stent surgically put into the artery to open the flow of blood to my leg. The wound began to slowly heal, but I still had a lot of pain in my right leg because a blood clot developed below my knee, causing the swelling & pain.

Last week I went to visit some friends in Chicago. Because of my leg pain, I went to the emergency room at Northwestern Medical Center in the city. While there, they took a full body ct scan & discovered I had a large malignant tumor on my right kidney. The tumor is about 8 cm & has been growing there for the past 30 years.

My niece miraculously got me an appointment with Dr. Paul Russo, a leading Kidney Cancer specialist, at Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in NYC. I am scheduled for a number of tests with various doctors next week & the surgery to remove the kidney I scheduled for Oct. 31st. There will be a 2-month recovery period where I will be staying with family in NJ. Hopefully I will be back in Florida in the New Year. So let me be the first to wish you a Happy Thanksgiving, Merry Christmas, & a Happy New Year.

I would ask that we pray for one another, especially during the challenges that come our way in life. Pray that the Lord will give us the strength, the courage, & the vision to see these challenges as opportunities to grow, to change & to become what God wants us to be. I will miss you all. I love you & I look forward to seeing you in the New Year. Blessings – Fr. Ray

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated in English each Saturday of each month following the 4:30pm Mass. Parents are required to be registered members of St. Peter and must attend a Baptismal Preparation Program. You are encouraged to attend the program before your baby is born. The upcoming English programs are Oct 12, Nov 9 & Dec 14 beginning promptly at 9:00am. Please register in advance.

Sacrament of Marriage: Marriages are celebrated on Saturdays at 11:00am and 2:00pm. Registered engaged couples should contact the Parish Office a minimum of 4 months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparations.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturday from 3:15pm-4:00pm or by appointment

Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament: On First Friday of each month, Adoration begins after the 8:00am Mass and concludes with a Benediction service at 7:00pm. All other Fridays during the month have Adoration until 10:00pm.

Divine Mercy Devotions: The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be recited Tuesday-Friday at 7:45am.

Eucharistic Ministers of Holy Communion: Active members of this ministry are required to attend a refresher training at least once a year. The next refresher training is scheduled for Nov 18. Please contact Leonardo Busa in the parish office if you are interested in joining this ministry.



Godparents/Sponsors: Must be Catholics who have been baptized and confirmed and they should be at least 16 years old. They should be practicing Catholics, going to Mass on Sundays and receiving Communion regularly. If married, they must be married in the Catholic Church. Godparents need a "Sponsor Certificate" from the parish where they are registered indicating that they are qualified to serve as godparents/sponsors.

Homebound or Critically Ill: If you are homebound and wish to receive the Eucharist please call Deacon Stephen Scienzo in the Parish Office.

Hospital Visitation: If you would like to receive Holy Communion while you are in the hospital, please register at the hospital as a Catholic.

Lectors: If you are interested in becoming a lector, please contact Leonardo Busa in the parish office. The next training will be on Nov 19.

Perpetual Novena of Our Lady: To Mary, The Immaculate Conception, Mondays before 8:00am Mass.

Registration: Seasonal Parishioners and permanent residents are requested to register in the Parish as soon as possible after moving into the Parish. Registration forms are available on our parish website and in the office.

Rosary Group: The Rosary is prayed Monday-Friday after the 8:00am Daily Mass.

All Saints School Parents: In order to qualify for the Catholic Tuition Rate discount offered to you as a parishioner, the following requirements must be met: 1. Be an active, practicing member of the parish - attending Mass on a regular basis with your family. 2. Be at the Stewardship Level of Offering. This is best achieved through our online giving program. 3. Be a participating member of the Ministries Program, which utilizes your time and talent to build a strong parish life. 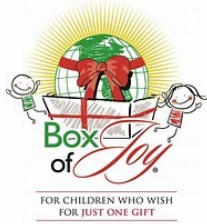

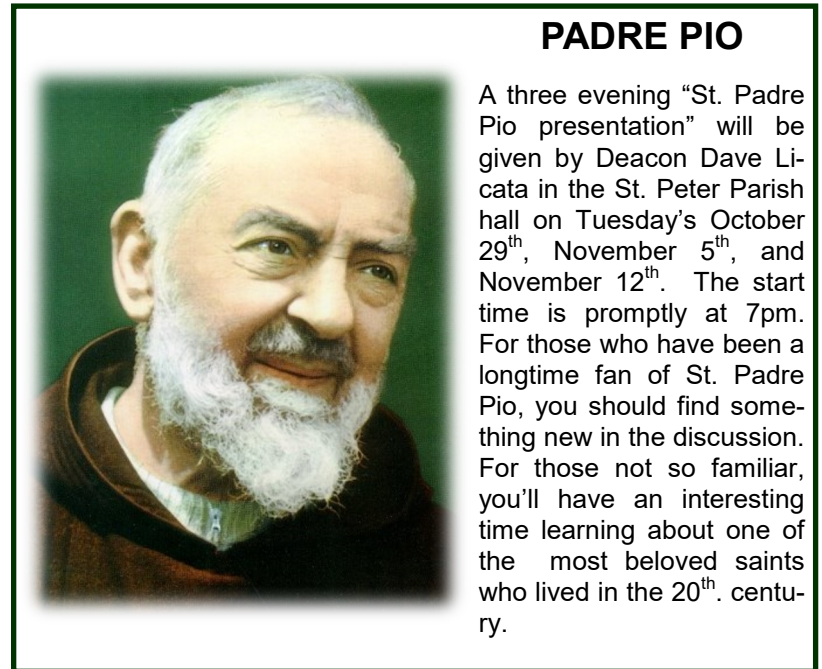

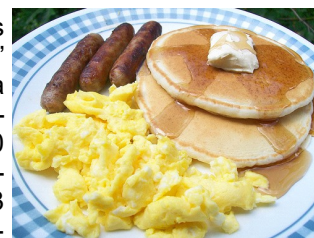
